District Vision

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District : Central Lombok
Name of Institute : Jaringan Masyarakat Sipil (JMS), West Lombok
Concept Paper Title : Capacity Building of Health Cadre to Prompt a Clean and Healthy Lifestyle (PHSB) in Kopang Rembiga District
Program Duration : 18 months

Berugak Dese, as a community organization involved in achieving the district citizen engagement plan vision in Central Lombok district has designed an action plan. This action plan aims to strengthen community health cadre to increase their capacity to facilitate and to prompt the community to participate in planning, implementation and monitoring and evaluation processes in order to instigate improved clean and healthy lifestyles; control health services and develop independence in developing clean and healthy lifestyles. It is also hoped that there will be opportunities for health cadre, village governments and other service and health actors to develop transformative processes in regard to information, skills and effective communication as well as developing networks with other stakeholders to prompt improved clean and healthy lifestyles. This action plan will be developed in five villages (Kopang Rembiga, Bebuak, Lendang Ara, Waja Geseng, Montong Gamang) in Kopang Rembiga sub-district. Strategies will consist of capacity building, developing working networks and pushing for comprehensive service centres for women and children. It is hoped that this action plan will work in synergy with the four main elements in local good governance, particularly in improving quality of public services and participation. The strategic direction of this action plan, which is to empower village facilitators to initiate community participation and community engagement with other stakeholders in order to achieve the action plan objectives and expand the influence of the project into five other villages, is in line with ACCESS Phase II.

Name of Institute : Konsorsium Lombok Tengah
Concept Paper Title : Accelerate Development by Strengthening Local Institutes and Policy Advocacy
Program Duration : 30 months

This action plan aims to strengthen the capacity of local institutes (village facilitators and supporting facilitators groups) to provide early input into budget policies so that the policies are supportive of women and the poor. This will involve prompting local institutes to engage to influence policies to be transparent in implementing and using funding for education, free health, infrastructure, economy and empowerment. This action plan will also prompt an increased role and participation of the community to monitor policy budgeting and implementation in the previously mentioned areas. It will also prompt Konsorsium Lombok Tengah member institutes to apply transparent and democratic values that support women and the poor into their regulations. Konsorsium Lombok Tengah will use strategies consisting of capacity building, public policy and budgeting analysis, policy advocacy and the formation of community complaint units. This action plan hopes to contribute to increased participation, transparency and accountability, and improve the quality of public services and social justice. This action plan is in line with ACCESS Phase II in its efforts to empower village and sub-district facilitators to strengthen the community to

initiate engagement and improve their quality of life. This action plan will also have a wide impact as it will be developed in seven sub-districts, which are Praya Timur, Batukliang Utara, Praya Barat Daya, Pringgarata, Jonggat, Janapriya and Praya Tengah in Central Lombok district.

Concept Paper Title : **Strengthening Women Small Business through Small Business
Network based on Local Resources.**
Program Duration : **30 Months**

ASSPUKK proposed an action plan which aims to encourage strong and independent women small business (PUK-Micro) and their organizations. Their organizations are able to develop strong local economic based on women's rights, democratic, prosperous, egalitarian, equitable and gender equity perspectives in the *Lombok Barat* district. Through this action plan ASSPUKK will facilitate women small business develop finance institution to provide financial support for women micro business as an alternative financial institution. This institution will also provide space to their member answering question concerning education, health, asset management. This action plan also was expected to produce behavioral changes in society, government and private sectors to really care on cultural tourism and local products, the economic policies that provide room for the women small business and their organizations to strengthen movement from below to encourage democratic local governance in Lombok Barat District. This Action Plan will use the strategy of developing business/ economic and PUK business management, advocacy and capacity building. This concept paper in accordance with the strategic direction of the ACCESS Phase II in strengthening Women Small Business (PUK), and engagement with other stakeholders in order to improve economic and social conditions of poor women.

Concept Paper Title : **Legality Community Based Forest Management in Mareje
Bonga Region Toward a Forest Democratic Governance**
Program Duration : **3 years**

This action plan has a long-term goals to support forest democratic governance in Mareje Bonga. While the medium-term goal of this program is the legality of forest management by communities in forest areas of Mareje Bonga. Strategy will be used to achieve these goals through institutional development by applying the principles of democratic governance and inclusive social and gender internally and through capacity building related to the design of forest management in a transparent, participatory, accountable and sustainable ways. Another strategy is to strengthen the capacity of forest community so they have the ability on forest management planning and ability to interact with the village development plans and other development programs. So, the community forest management plan can be integrated to the village planning. The principle of citizen empowerment and engagement between stakeholder in the community based forest governance is in line with the direction of ACCESS Phase II.
