#### Dompu District Vision

#### **VISION FOR LOCAL DEMOCRATIC GOVERNANCE IN DOMPU TO BRING ABOUT DOMPU WHICH IS MANGGINI, MANGGARI, MATAROA**

Dompu district *manggini, manggari, mataroa* illustrates a process of development planning, implementation and monitoring that is done in a participatory manner and includes all stakeholders. Planning will include groups (citizens, CSOs, project/donors and other development stakeholders) alongside with Bappeda and Litbang, as the bodies that have a role in the process of village development. This process will be able to develop the independence of citizens in the development process and will improve the quality of services in education, health and other basic services. Basically, the prosperity of the community will be improved.

The District Stakeholder Committee (DSC) will be a player in encouraging active engagement, communication, coordination and shared learning. The DSC will use the government joint secretariate to ensure the participation of the community in planning and budgeting that is transparent and accountable at the village, sub-district and district level.

Complete and accurate data and information will be provided, easy to access, and used by all stakeholders in the planning, implementation and monitoring of village development. This data and information will also clearly map out the potential, assets and opportunities that exist so they can be optimised in the development process outlined above.

Development programs will be focussed on improving the quality of education services, health and other basic needs. The quality of services will be supported by changes in behaviour that are professional and in line with basic minimum service standards and also supported with appropriate and high quality infrastructure. Throughout Dompu education infrastructure will be available, there will be access to the market and a PUSPELKEs that is able to give efficient, quality and appropriate service that is affordable for the poor. All infrastructure and tools will be environmentally friendly.

Law enforcement will be done in a fair and transparent way and will be undertaken to guarantee protection for the poor, women and children and other marginal groups. As a result there will be no violence and the basic rights of citizens will be protected. Equity between men and women will be realized.

There will be pro-poor policies that will take into account women, children, youth and other marginal groups. These policies will be implemented in an optimal way so they are able to provide basic quality services that reach everyone and are able to increase the incomes of families. The APBD must outline the value of public expenditure and the expenditure for the government must be proportional and must be managed in an effective and efficient manner to ensure the self-interest of the

community are taken into account. The growth of children, participation and protection will be evident. The development process will take into consideration children and youth and build their potential in line with their individual talents and this will be taken into consideration in policy and budget in the areas of sports, the arts, culture and education.

Public policies will be supported by a strong collective from development actors. The DPRD as well as the executive will give service without putting themselves first. The Members will play an active and optimal role in undertaking their main function in budgeting, legislating and monitoring. The Members will openly inform the public regarding the agendas that are of public interest.

In managing natural resources, environmental protection, the self-interests of the community and fulfilling the needs of youth workers will be prioritized. The private sector or investors who come to Dompu will transparently present their concepts for industry in an open forum including the community, CSOs and local government, so that development of industry is transparent, accountable, effective, efficient and environmental friendly. The management Tambora and other areas will be undertaken with the principles of equality, environment and community participation.

The social economic potential will be managed in a wise way to increase the income and well being of the community. Farmers and fisher people will be aware of their own development needs to be able to manage sustainable crops/stock as evidence of food security that is managed in a collective and values-based manner using local knowledge. There will be Community Banks for the poor that will provide capital without the need for a guarantor.

The role of the media will be to disseminate information that is needed. There will be publications with information regarding assets, potential and successful development examples that can easily be attained by the community. Print and electronic media will work effectively and be proportional and prepared to publish learning from the community as a control tool for the development process.

Dompu district 'Madani' will have high quality leaders that are pro-poor and are able to manage the natural resources with wisdom and will take into account environmental sustainability, religious values, social cultural aspects and local knowledge. Religious institutions will not only be a place of worship, but as a place for citizens, particularly the women, children and the poor, to discuss social change.

**Organisation:** LenSA Dompu  
**Topic:** Advocating Policy and the Participation of the community in the Process of Planning and Budgeting that is Pro-poor  
**Location**  
**Period** -

Analysis shows that the national standard for planning is not yet being optimised in Dompu from the village level through to the District level, which provides a basis for LenSA to facilitate the drafting of local regulations for planning and budgeting that will be used at all levels and the provision of necessary resources for a participatory development process. LenSA’s agenda will be dedicated 1). Developing critical awareness of the community on the urgency of participatory planning and budgeting; 2) Develop consolidation and a community movement to realize a participatory process for planning and budgeting that is pro-poor; 3) Build the commitment of government and civil society to implement participatory processes for participatory and pro-poor planning. The strategy will include capacity building, community organizing, network strengthening, advocacy, information dissemination and continuous learning.

**Topic:** Strengthening Planning and Budgeting for Participatory Village Development that is Transparent and Accountable in an Effort to Improve Local Democratic Governance in Dompu.  
**Location:** Dompu (40 villages in 6 subdistricts--Hu'u (6 villages),Kec. Pajo (5 villages),Kec.Manggelewa(6 villages),Kec .Dompu (8 villages)Kec. Woja (9 villages) and Kec. Kilo (6 villages)--  
**Period:** -

**Strengthening what the village already has, such as village facilitators, cadre networks and community organizations was the driving force for LESPEL to broaden their efforts in participatory and pro-poor planning and budgeting.** With experience and success in implementing Village economic units (BumDes) in Dompu, LESPEL saw that there was other potential in the villages that could be developed to support good local democratic governance. LESPEL proposed an Action Plan that would be able to improve the bargaining position of the community, particularly the poor, women and other marginal groups, in developing planning and budgeting in a participatory manner. The Action Plan will also look at encouraging the Executive and Legislative to strengthen the support system for planning and budgeting so that it is more responsive to the needs of women and the poor and to encourage village and local government to become models for public service delivery that is

transparent, accountable and socially just. LESPEL has identified a number of institutions such as the BPMD, BAPPEDA, NGOs, the DSC, members of the legislative, PNPM and PKH, village cadre and village organisations as potential actors who will be able to realise the dream. Their Concept Paper outlined a strategy which included empowerment and capacity building, pushing for engagements between the stakeholders and scaling-up impacts. There are a number of other organisations including YPN, LPKM, Madafaku, LPMP, SBMI, YP2MD, SAMBIRIO and LEPAS who would be support team for the implementation of this agenda.

**Topic** Increasing the participation and interaction between stakeholders in Sustainable Natural Resource Management  
**Location** All villages in subdistrict Pukat and Kempo  
**Period** -

After doing participatory livelihood analysis and surveys on the status of nutrition in Tambora and Sorinomo villages, YBC realized the importance sustainable natural resource management. YBC with YBN and SAMBIRIO developed an Action Plan in support of the District Vision and Agenda for Dompu. The aim of the Action Plan is to improve interaction between stakeholders in natural resource management. This will be done by strengthening the capacity of local institutions as a support for, and a driving force in the community. The Action Plan will also include accurate participatory data collection of village resources as the basis for developing local regulations. The Plan will encourage stakeholders to collaborate and work together in resource management that is socially equitable and push for regulations that will accommodate natural resource management. The stakeholders that will be involved include the village government, sub-district government, the Tambora Area Forum, FP2KK Kempo, Community based organisations and other development actors, including PNPM, World Neighbours and Bappeda for Dompu.

**Topic** Program to improve the quality of public services in the free health and education program Dompu NTB  
**Location** 8 subdistricts in (all the subdistricts)  
**Period** -

This Concept Paper looks at improving the quality of public services in the implementation of the Free Health and Free Education program in Dompu District. The aim of the program is: 1). Encourage active engagement between the stakeholders involved in the implementation of these programs; 2). Improve the transparency and accountability in the implementation of these programs; 3). Encourage multi-stakeholder action in the implementation of the programs; 4). Encourage gender and social inclusion principles to be

implemented 5). Improve the management and primary service delivery of the free health and education programs so that all community members receive service through these programs; 6). Develop a suitable monitoring and evaluation methodology for these programs. The strategy to be used will be through mentoring and developing communication mechanisms, through public involvement in monitoring, information dissemination, capacity building and community organizing. The stakeholders involved include the Bupati, the DPRD, Muspida, relevant SKPD, community groups, CSOs, the sub-district government and village government, the press, school committees and the public.

Le-PAS developed an Action Plan to provide social protection, legal support and counselling for the complex issue of violence within the community, particularly for women and children as well as issues of violence related to migrant workers. This Action Plan comes out of the Vision and Agenda developed for Dompu. The aim is to provide counselling support and improve the self-confidence of victims of violence so they are able to become active citizens within their community again. The Plan will look at developing coping strategies for victims and advocating for social services, including legal services, and community awareness regarding domestic violence. The beneficiaries will be victims of domestic violence, migrant workers who are being mistreated with violence, family victims of violence, TKI/TKW nominees, village government. The strategy will include surveys and data collection, PRA, policy advocacy, capacity building, safe house/shelter services, organizational strengthening, study tours to see how domestic violence issues are being addressed with success elsewhere, mentoring and network building.
